This week is British Science Week. Alongside our usual science lessons, we have had lots of fun taking part in activities planned for Science Week 2019, with the focus being on 'Journeys.'

We created a 'sneeze zone' and measured how far water droplets travelled from a water sprayer. We were surprised to find out how far germs can travel. This has made us think carefully about using tissues when we sneeze!



Some children thought about 'Journeys on Earth and Beyond.' We had some super designs for helicopters, gliders and planes along with space rovers. There were some brilliant ideas on how to make efficient vehicles and how they could be improved after testing.

We considered 'Electrical Journeys' and had fun creating static electricity with balloons that made objects appear to float. Some children made some model neurons; they found out that our brains have over 80 billion neurons that send messages from our brains.
